Background: Conflict Minerals

- Conflict Minerals are gold and the ores from which tin, tantalum, and tungsten are derived.
- In the U.S., there were concerns that the exploitation and trade of conflict minerals by armed groups was helping to finance conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and surrounding countries and was contributing to an emergency humanitarian crisis.
- In response, the U.S. Congress passed legislation that requires publicly traded companies to file disclosures and reports with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission related to the use and source of Conflict Minerals in the company's products. (Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act.)
- The Dodd-Frank Act does not require companies to stop sourcing and using Conflict Minerals. Instead, the Dodd-Frank Act requires public disclosure relating to sourcing and using of Conflict Minerals.

Map of Countries in Scope of U.S. Conflict Minerals




EU Conflict Minerals

- On 1 January 2021 the EU Conflict Minerals Regulation became effective. The regulation is on conflict-affected or high-risk areas.
- Due diligence obligations are placed on EU importers of conflict minerals.
- Supply chains may be affected by importers who do not comply. Therefore, to mitigate risk, suppliers should have due diligence process in place.

Supplier Requirements

Abbott's Expectation of Suppliers

- Suppliers must report on the source and chain of custody of the Conflict Minerals in the product/part/components supplied to Abbott via the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT).
- The CMRT was developed by the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI). It is the standard form used for reporting on Conflict Minerals.
- The latest version of the CMRT has been sent to suppliers and should be completed for the current year.
- The latest version can also be accessed from the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI) website: CMRT Form.




EXAMPLE 1

- All mandatory fields MUST be completed. An incomplete form will be rejected.
- For example, the yellow rows indicate that mandatory information is missing.





EXAMPLE 2

• When supplier selects declaration scope as Product Level, the product information must be completed in the Product List tab. All products/parts provided to Abbott must be listed.






EXAMPLE 3

- If supplier declared a presence of one or more of the minerals in Q2 of the CMRT form, the Smelter information must be completed in the Smelter List tab. Use the drop down list in the form to complete the Smelter information. Begin by selecting the Metal.
- Select "Smelter Not Listed" if smelter is not found in the Smelter Look-up. Complete all mandatory fields.
